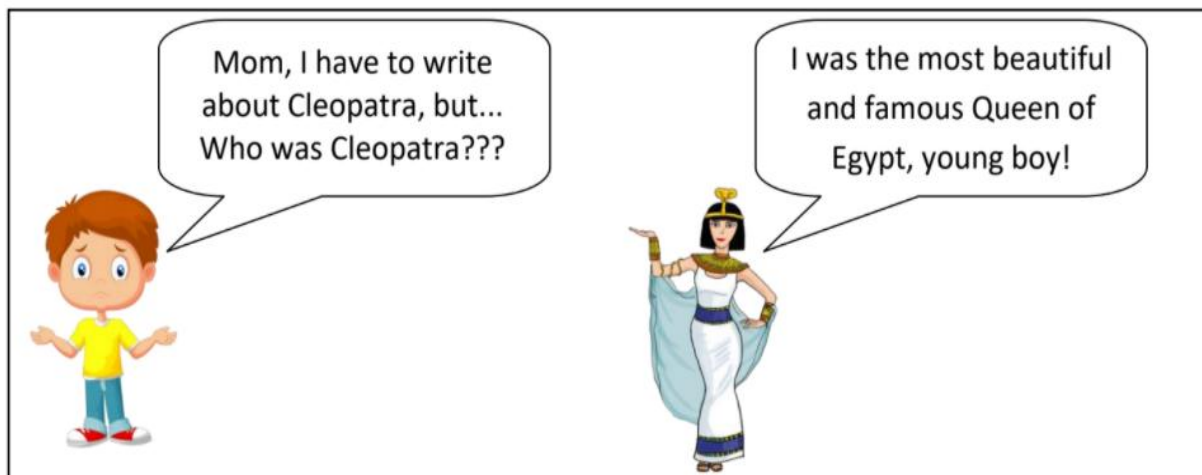


Question 1 – Read the comic strip and write (T) for true or (F) for false.
